A Helpful Teaching Aid

Dear Brother Ron and Sister Shirley,

Enclosed is a teaching tool the Holy Spirit showed me ten years ago or so which irrefutably proves the teaching of keeping the ten commandments in the New Testament.

I have used this teaching aid for years and have not had one person deny it. It has been so successful with Sunday keepers that I am led to share it with you in hopes that you would post it on your website to be available to your readers to use when instructing Sunday keepers and others also.

When I use it as a teaching aid I hold it up before them with the ten commandment side facing them and read the back side as I trace down the left hand side (looking from the front) as I read about the first commandment and down the right hand side (looking from the front) as I read about the second commandment.

Just before I get to Luke 10:25-28 on the back side I stop and ask them how great it would be if we all had an opportunity to ask Jesus just one question and should that question be "How are we saved"? They all agree. Then I would say: "Did you know that there was a man who asked Jesus that very same question in the Bible?" (I never met any Sunday keeper who knew this.) At this point I read Luke 10:25-28 from the backside of the paper as I continue to hold it up before them. They are stunned. Then I say to them. "Lets read that from the Bible, just to be sure" After reading it from the Bible they are still speechless.

The last paragraph is for more advanced students and will require further elaboration.

Not in all these years have I found anyone who has ever heard of this teaching aid before. I am sure everyone will be happy with it.

May the Lord continue blessing both of you.

Please notice that the first Commandment (I-IV), shows us how to love and honor God the Father and the second, (V-X), how to love and honor our neighbor.

Matthew 22:36-40 KJV

36 Master, which is the great commandment in the law?

37 Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.

38 This is the first and great commandment.

39 And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

40 On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

Mark 12:28-34 KJV

28 And one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together, and perceiving that he had answered them well, asked him, Which is the first commandment of all?

29 And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord:

30 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment.

31 And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.

32 And the scribe said unto him, Well, Master, thou hast said the truth: for there is one God; and there is none other but he:

33 And to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love his neighbour as himself, is more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.

34 And when Jesus saw that he answered discreetly, he said unto him, Thou art not far from the kingdom of God. And no man after that durst ask him any question.

Luke 10:25-28 KJV

25 ¶ And, behold, a certain lawyer stood up, and tempted him, saying Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?

26 He said unto him, What is written in the law? how readest thou?

27 And he answering said, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbour as thyself.

28 And he said unto him, Thou hast answered right: this do, and thou shalt live.

John 14:15, 16 KJV

15 If ye love me, keep my commandments.16 And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever.

Notice He said, **KEEP** my commandments, not **obey**, for no man can obey all His ten commandments. He is saying: do not disregard or throw them away, **KEEP** them. His theology is of course, correct.
